The Walter Royal Davis Library is the central library for the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. More than one million visitors come to Davis Library each year to consult collections of national standing, receive research advice and assistance, or find a quiet spot to read or study. Most humanities, social science, business, and foreign language materials are in Davis Library, along with maps, government documents, numeric/statistical data, and microforms.

Using Davis Library

Carrels and Studies

Faculty, graduate students, and those undergraduates working on honors theses are eligible for a carrel or study. Apply at the Circulation desk.

Computing

General use computers for UNC affiliates are on the 1st floor. Visitors with a valid ID may register at the Circulation desk for one-hour access.

Group Study Rooms

Located on the 3rd through 8th floors, several group study rooms can be reserved through the Circulation desk.

Research Hub

The second floor of Davis Library offers a center for researchers interested in working with data, mapping, texts, and technology. Find equipment and expertise for geographic information systems (GIS), numeric data services, text and data mining, digital humanities, and more.

Services for Patrons with Disabilities

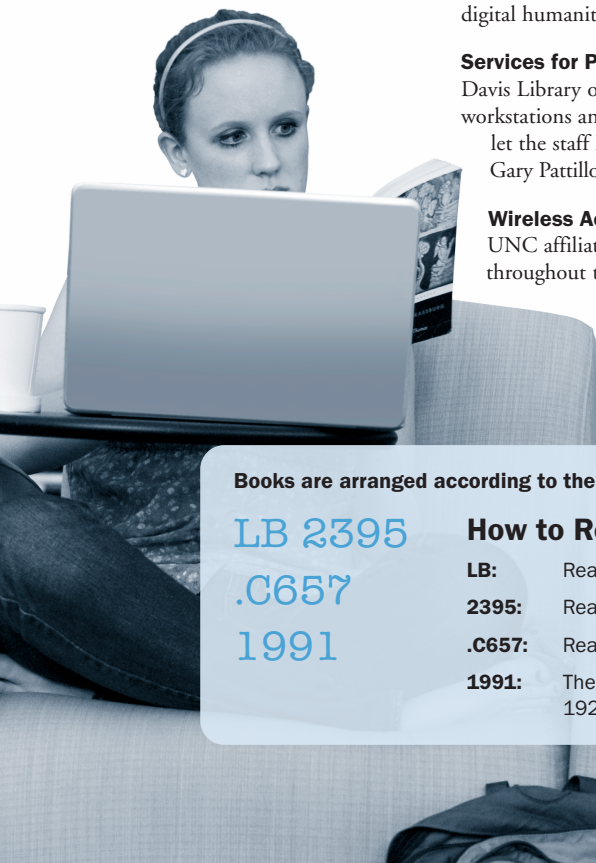

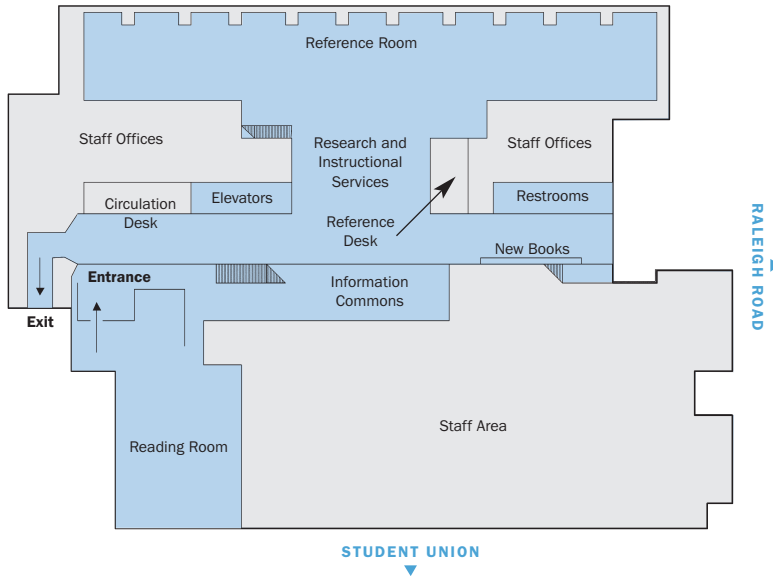

How to Read an LC Call Number

- LB:** Read the first line in alphabetical order: A, B, C...L, LA, **LB**, LC, LD, M, N, O P, PR, PS.
- 2395:** Read as a whole number: 1, 2, 3, 100, 101, 200, 2000, **2395**, 2400, 3000...
- .C657:** Read the letters alphabetically, the numbers as a decimal: **.C657** = .657, .C72 = .72
- 1991:** The last line is the year the book was published. Read in chronological order (not all books have this line): 1924, 1925, 1985, **1991**, 2004

Microforms: Lower Level (Enter at Reference desk)

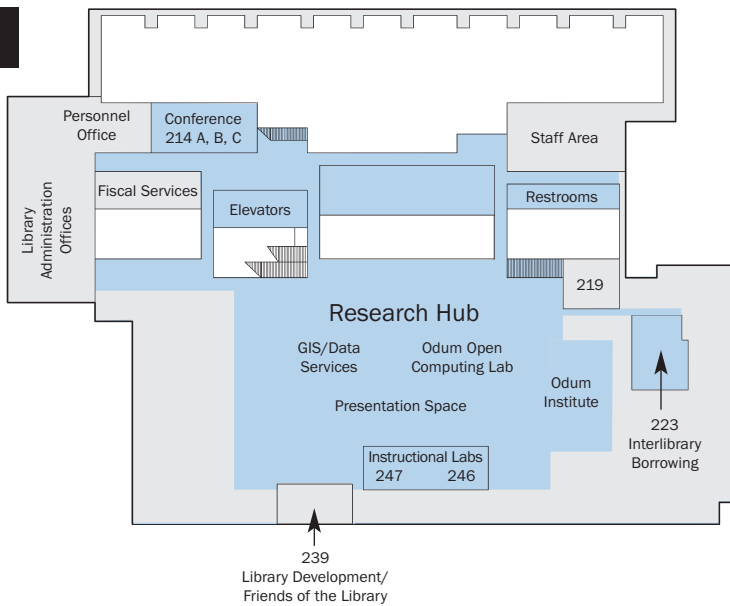
Magazines/Journals/Newspapers: Bound print periodicals are shelved with the book collection. Current print issues are shelved in the Reference Room on the 1st Floor. Ask at the Circulation desk for items with Storage as their location. Thousands of journals are available electronically.

Government Documents/Maps: 1st Floor and Lower Level. Ask staff at Reference desk for assistance.
